- Diorama of your favorite part of the book. (Be sure to label it with the name of the book, the author, and a description of the scene.)

Please bring your completed project to school before September 26th.

We hope you read other books this summer, too. We encourage you to use the 3rd grade book list to guide you in choosing some additional books to help you grow as a reader and thinker. There is also a Reading Log to record the books you read. Please bring the log to school during the first week back. If you read five books or more, you will get a certificate of participation and be eligible for a special prize!
